

Arizona, California, New Mexico and Texas Departments of Transportation are conducting a study to produce a Concept of Operations (ConOps) for implementing operations and technologies that create a streamlined, connected vehicle experience for safe carriers across this four-state section of the I-10 Corridor, from Los Angeles, California to Houston and Beaumont, Texas, reducing friction for goods movement and expanding economic development in the West. This ConOps will be a user-oriented, non-technical document that describes this freight corridor's operational characteristics from the viewpoints of various stakeholders who will use the corridor.
